# **VOCA Funding Review FY20: Reflection & Outlook**

The Virginia Department of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) administers federal Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) funds which support crime victim assistance projects statewide. The VOCA funding allocation significantly increased in recent years and is set to increase again. We are seeking your input and expertise to better understand the impact of VOCA funding currently, and to identify and prioritize gaps in services as well as new and innovative services and projects. We are asking you to reflect on how the funds have been utilized and to consider how Virginia could most effectively use the anticipated increase in VOCA funds.

Your feedback will help to create the future of victims' services in Virginia. Through this review, we hope to learn more about:

- where the priorities are in victims' services,
- which areas have been enhanced as a result of VOCA funding,
- what the needs are in your community, and
- what ideas you have to provide and enhance services to victims in your areas of expertise.
