The purpose for the Addiction Recovery Grant Program (ARGP) is to develop a model addiction recovery program that may be administered by Sheriffs, Deputy Sheriffs, Jail Officers, Administrators, or Superintendents in any local or regional jail. The programs will be based on best practices suggested by existing research, related standards developed for substance use disorder treatment and criminal justice programming, as well as what experts and experienced practitioners have found to work best for intervention in criminal justice settings.

There are currently four ARGP programs in Virginia; all receive grant funding from DCJS at \$38,400 per program per year. For Fiscal Year 2025, DCJS received four (4) applications. DCJS staff request approval to award \$153,600 in state funds to 4 Addiction Recover Grant Programs. DCJS staff denied zero (0) applications.

In summary, DCJS staff request approval to fund four (4) projects for the 12-month fiscal year (07/01/2024 – 06/30/2025), totaling \$153,600, using State General Funds allocated for this purpose.

The program involves a three-step program over the course of 6 months for a class size of 4.8 offenders. The program begins with the offender Finding his Identity, followed by a portion that involves life skills building in order to begin re-entry into the community, and ending with a phase that is having the offender become service oriented by working within the community. The largest goal for this program is to assist the offender to overcome his addiction and to prepare to be re-entered into society.	Continuation of Grant
526393	Addiction Recovery Grant Program	Newport News	City Government	\$ 38,400.00	\$ 38,400.00	Meets Criteria	Upon release from incarceration, individuals with substance abuse disorders are eligible for services under Community Crossroads to continue substance abuse treatment and wrap around re-entry services to improve their chances of remaining in their communities as productive, crime- free and drug-free citizens. All participants of Community Crossroads are required to participate in the jail's post-release re-entry program and are assessed using an evidence-based tool designed to assess an offender's likelihood of criminological behavior. They are assigned a re-entry case manager who coordinates services such as housing, transportation, counseling, Medicaid, job readiness training and preparation, family unification and other services.

The program will provide reentry and recovery services to offenders who are within 60-120 days of release. The program will provide support services using the peer-recovery approach. These services will address substance use, offender re-entry (job readiness skills, trauma, family matters, domestic violence, finance, and budgeting), with the understanding that some collaboration will be through Zoom due to the Covid-19 pandemic. The program will continue to provide the continuum of care model.
