Re: FY25 Drive to Work Grant Program

The Department of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) administers general appropriation funds to Drive to Work (DTW). The Appropriations Act provides DTW with \$75,000 in state general funds and an additional \$75,000 in federal funds when available. The federal funds have historically come from the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG).

DTW provides assistance to low income and previously incarcerated individuals to restore their driving privileges so they can drive to work and maintain employment. DTW is the only organization which provides legal assistance to help individuals whose licenses are suspended by the Virginia Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) to reinstate their driver's license. They also provide educational services to individuals wishing to have their licenses reinstated.

DCJS received one application from the DTW Program requesting a total of \$150,000, with \$75,000 in state general funds and an additional \$75,000 in federal funds.

No applications were denied.

In summary, DCJS staff respectfully **requests approval to award the DTW Program in Fiscal Year 2025** (July 1, 2024-June 30, 2025), a total of \$150,000, using State General Funds and Federal Funds from the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) allocated for this purpose.
