The Residential Substance Abuse Treatment for State Prisoners (RSAT) Program receives federal funds from the Department of Justice (DOJ), Office of Justice Programs (OJP), Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA). These RSAT grant funds provide opportunities to allow for the creation, implementation, and enhancement of evidence-based residential substance use treatment programs, including Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) services, in local and regional jails in collaboration with a community services board or community non-profit organizations.

The purpose of the RSAT Program is to break the cycle of drug addiction and violence by reducing the demand for, use, and trafficking of illegal drugs. RSAT's objectives are to enhance the capabilities of states and units of local and tribal governments to provide residential substance abuse treatment for incarcerated individuals, prepare individuals for reintegration into communities, and assist individuals and communities through the reentry process by delivering community-based treatment and other broad-based aftercare services.

The RSAT programs in Virginia all receive grant funding from DCJS. Funds are awarded by an application process for a yearly solicitation released by DCJS. RSAT funds are administered to the Commonwealth of Virginia from the Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance. DCJS has been awarded RSAT funding for programming that are currently funded through Federal Grants 2020-J2-BX-0042, 15PBJA-21-GG-00086, 15PBJA-22-GG000499, and 15PBJA-23-GG-01563. Grantees are required to provide 25% in cash and/or in-kind matching funds. Federal funds under this award may not cover more than 75% of the total cost of the project.

For Fiscal Year 2025, DCJS received seven applications for RSAT funding. DCJS staff request approval to award \$483,098 in Federal Funds, with a \$161,036 match requirement, for a total of \$644,134. DCJS staff denied zero (0) applications.

In summary, DCJS staff **request approval to fund seven projects for the 12-month fiscal year (07/01/2024 – 06/30/2025), totaling \$644,134**, using Federal Funds and Match for this purpose.
