Re: 2025 Combatting Hate Crimes Grant Program

The purpose of the Combatting Hate Crimes Grant Program is to minimize bias-motivated incidents by providing funding that supports institutions and/or nonprofit organizations within a locality that may be at risk for targeted, bias-motivated violence based on race, religious conviction, color, gender, disability, gender identity, sexual orientation, or national origin. State general funds in the amount of \$3.5 million are available for distribution.

DCJS received 13 applications with requests totaling \$1,612,314. For FY2025, staff is recommending funding of seven applications in the amount of \$668,622.

The grant period for this award is from January 1, 2025 – December 31, 2025.

Staff is **not recommending funding for six applications totaling \$744,220** due to requests for ineligible equipment or failure to provide a clear, justifiable connection to the purpose of the Hate Crimes Grant Program.

In summary, DCJS staff request approval to fund seven awards, totaling \$668,622, for the 12-month period (1/1/2025-12/31-2025), using state general funds designated for this purpose.
