Re: FY2026 School Security Officer (SSO) New and Continuation Grant Applications

Name of Person Presenting: Mr. Tracy Matthews, Law Enforcement Grants and Programs, Manager, Public Safety Training and Virginia Center for School and Campus Safety

The purpose of the School Resource Officer (SRO)/School Security Officer (SSO) Incentive Grant Program is to continue funding and establish new funding for SRO and SSO positions in Virginia public schools. SRO positions provide law enforcement and security services to schools across the Commonwealth, and SSO positions maintain order and discipline, prevent crime, and investigate violations of school board policies. Funding originates from *Code of Virginia* § 9.1-110.

The FY2026 School Security Office (SSO) Incentive Grant Program funding opportunity is intended to fund the continuation of existing SSO grants that have not exceeded their four-year grant cycle. The funding opportunity also includes the resubmission of FY2025 SSO applications for new positions that were not funded last year due to lack of available funding.

<sup>\*</sup>Six (6) applications are recommended for an increase in funding due to the match funding and/or requested funding being incorrect on the initial application.

Three (3) applications were denied. Two (2) applications were determined ineligible as they were intended for FY2026 new positions (not FY2025 resubmissions). One (1) application was an incorrect submission, as it was an SRO application mistakenly submitted through the SSO funding opportunity. This application was withdrawn in coordination with the applicant. It has been resubmitted in the SRO funding opportunity.

Recommended funding supports SSO positions for school divisions across the Commonwealth, necessary SSO equipment, and expenses for some participants to attend the DCJS School Safety Training Forum.

In summary, DCJS staff request approval to fund 46 grant applications for the 12-month period (7/1/2025-6/30/2026), totaling \$8,434,164, using \$5,493,392 of SRO/SSO Incentive Grant Program funding and \$2,940,772 in local match.

Martinsville City Public Schools is applying for 2 School Security Officer positions, 1 for high school and 1 middle school levels. The SSO activities and duties will include, but not limited to, maintain order and discipline, investigate breaches of school board policies, work to ensure safety and welfare of students and staff, and collaborate with the school resource officer on crime preventive measures.
