The purpose of the CCCA/PSA funding opportunity is to support local community-based probation and pretrial services agencies established and operating under the authority of the Comprehensive Community Corrections Act for Local-Responsible Officers (CCCA) and the Pretrial Services Act (PSA), as specified in the *Code of Virginia*. Funding is open to existing agencies meeting the requirements set forth in the *Code*.

The CCCA authorizes the creation of local, community-based probation agencies. First established in 1995, these agencies provide a sentencing option for courts to use for individuals convicted of certain misdemeanors or non-violent felonies for which sentences would be 12 months or less in a local or regional jail. Local community-based probation agencies provide services or referrals to services to include community service, assessment, education and/or treatment, and substance abuse testing.

Pretrial services agencies were first created in Virginia in 1989, pursuant to authorizing language in the Appropriation Act. In 1995, pretrial services agencies were authorized by statute with the passage of the PSA. Pretrial services agencies provide information, to include risk of failure to appear for court hearings and risk to public safety, to judicial officers (judges and magistrates) to help them make release decisions. Pretrial services agencies also supervise those released to the community and ordered to pretrial supervision pending trial. Pretrial

services assist court-ordered individuals in meeting the conditions of their bail, such as compliance with substance abuse testing and electronic monitoring.

There were no applications denied. Funding recommendations account for the base award from FY2025, plus increases accounting for need and available funding, as well as bonuses and raises directed through the Appropriation Act for state funded local employees.

Grant awards are primarily for the salaries and fringe benefits of sworn pretrial and local probation officers. Additional expenses include office supplies, VCIN software, drug testing materials, office space rent, telephone service for operations, and memberships or professional trainings for staff.

In summary, DCJS staff request approval to fund 37 grant applications for the 12-month period (7/1/2025-6/30/2026), totaling \$33,032,615 using state general funds allocated for this purpose.

Community Corrections Services (CCS) is a combined Comprehensive Community Corrections Act/Pretrial Services Act Agency serving both Chesterfield County and the City of Colonial Heights. Chesterfield County serves as the fiscal agent. Public safety is the primary goal of this initiative. Our agency emphasizes the use of evidence-based practices to improve outcomes. We use risk assessments, success plans and trailer tools such as the Ontario Domestic Violence Risk Assessment. Staff use motivational interviewing, Effective Practices in Correctional Supervision (EPICS), and Strategies for Effective Practices in Correctional Supervision (EPICS), and strategies for Effective Practices in Correctional Supervision to enhance client interactions and impact the client's intrinsic motivation to make positive changes.	Chesapeake Community Corrections provides both pre- and post-trial supervision to individuals residing in Chesapeake in an effort to reduce jail overcrowding, and to provide effective and evidence-based sentencing alternatives to the Chesapeake Courts. Funding will support 8 full-time and 2 part-time employees, as well as providing office space and oversight of a part-time MH probation officer, funded through the local Community Services Board. Staffing includes probation and pretrial officers, pretrial investigators, an administrative assistant, intake officer and a coordinator.	CCCA provides adult probation supervision and facilitates client engagement in rehabilitative services for Arlington and Falls Church, EBP risk assessments, support for Court referrals, and intensive supervision for the Behavioral Health Docket. Also, it notifies the Court when clients complete or incur violations and enhances public safety for the community. PSA works with the courts and the Magistrate to effectively supervise defendants who are diverted to pretrial supervision. The supervision process includes screening interviews, weekly office visits, telephone calls, drug/alcohol screens, and agency referrals. Notification is made to the Courts regarding non-compliance.	Enhancing public safety is the primary goal of this grant. There are three broad purposes: effective sentencing/ effective use of public resources & involvement in local communities in developing & implementing cognitive programs. Anticipated implementation activities include PSLP database, success plans, in-house substance use and mental health assessments. Funds will support providing alternatives to incarceration, effective community supervision and enhanced public safety while holding offenders accountable. We will serve approximately 535 individuals. Some items to be purchased are laptops, drug tests and office supplies. 10 staff: Director, Deputy Director, Compliance Auditor, Admin Technician, 3 Pretrial Officers, 3 Probation Officers.	OAR/Jefferson Area provides Local Probation Services in nine localities and Pretrial Services for Charlottesville, Albemarle, Nelson, Fluvanna, Orange, Greene, Louisa, and Madison. The goals of the project are to enhance public and community safety by providing supervision service through a variety of options including defendant background information and recommendations that assist judicial officers in determining or reconsidering bail decisions, supervised release on bail in lieu of secure bond; and community-based supervision to reduce the number of non-violent offenders in jail, thus reducing overcrowding in the jails.	The CCCA and the Pretrial Services Program work hand in hand to offer innovative solutions within the criminal justice system.
