The purpose of this grant funding opportunity is to continue to support existing programs that provide evidence-based Residential Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Treatment Programs, which may include Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) services within juvenile detention centers, local and regional jails, or prisons. The funding may also be used for aftercare SUD treatment programs that serve individuals who are transitioning from a SUD treatment program in a jail or detention center.

This was a level funded, continuation funding opportunity and there were **no applications denied**. One (1) grant was reduced to the level funded, allowable amount.

Funds are used to support personnel and consultants that provide direct services to incarcerated individuals, staff training relating to substance use disorders and evidence-based curriculum, as well as medications and reentry supplies.

In summary, **DCJS staff request approval to fund 5 grant applications for the 12-month period (7/1/2025-6/30/2026), totaling \$556,180**, using \$416,598 in federal funds and \$139,582 in subrecipient match contributions.

551297	George Mason Univ	State University	Continuation of Grant	\$120,716.00	\$120,716.00	Meets criteria	George Mason University's jail-based Medication for Addiction Treatment (JMAT) program delivers MOUD, peer-led recovery services, and integrated reentry planning at the Prince William/Manassas Adult Detention Center. This expansion focuses on reaching high-risk individuals not previously engaged in treatment, including those with co-occurring conditions or unstable social support. Through screening, Suboxone initiation, therapy, and peer navigation, JMAT reduces overdose risk and improves post-release continuity of care. RSAT funds will support service scale-up, partner coordination, and peer capacity.
551263	Henrico, County	County Government	Continuation of Grant	\$120,000.00	\$118,970.00	Meets criteria	Henrico County Sheriff's Office (HCSO) will continue to provide substance abuse treatment and medication assisted treatment (MAT) using Sublocade, combined with counseling and cognitive behavioral therapy (CBT). Best practices will be used to effectively implement these programs along with the collaboration of jail security staff, mental health clinicians, and medical providers. This process is meant to treat addiction from the disease model and utilize a holistic approach to improve an offenders physical and mental well-being to promote successful recovery upon re-entry into the community.
551020	Newport News, City	City Government	Continuation of Grant	\$120,000.00	\$120,000.00	Meets criteria	The Newport News-MAT program accepts incarcerated participants and participants in the community referred from other MAT programs. While incarcerated in the Newport News City Jail, inmates diagnosed with substance use disorders are screened by mental health and medical providers on site and referred to NN-MAT for potential services. A recovery case manager (RCM) is immediately assigned. If the inmate expresses an interest in receiving treatment, they are placed in the Crossroads substance abuse unit to complete the evidence-based program and are assigned a peer recovery support specialist and a counselor. Prior to release, the inmate receives a Vivitrol injection. The RCM coordinates all wrap around services.
551030	Norfolk, City	City Government	Continuation of Grant	\$120,000.00	\$120,000.00	Meets criteria	The Norfolk City Jail will continue to provide a comprehensive substance abuse treatment program offering cognitive behavior therapy with group and individual counseling with licensed substance abuse counselors, reentry services, Trauma Informed Care, and medication assisted treatment for offenders. After Program completion, inmates will be evaluated for participation in vocational, educational, or work release programs. Our program will decrease recidivism, enhance public safety, and close gaps in the availability of therapeutic services to incarcerated populations.
551481	Western Virginia Regional Jail Authority	County Government	Continuation of Grant	\$76,494.00	\$76,494.00	Meets criteria	Western Virginia Regional Jail (WVJRJ) will provide substance abuse treatment and medication assisted treatment (MAT) for participants in the RSAT-MAT program which includes a 16-week residential component. Based on evidence-based practices and the therapeutic community (TC) model, RSAT-MAT provides group counseling, one-on-one interactions, and other cognitive-behavioral change activities. Upon completing RSAT-MAT, participants will be eligible for a variety of aftercare services that would include medical, psychological and primary care services, job placement, and housing.
