The purpose of the Victim Witness Grant Program (VWGP) is to provide financial support to 112 local and 3 statewide victim assistance programs. These programs provide direct services, information, and assistance to victims of crime as required by the *Code of Virginia* § 19.2-11.01. Approximately half of the funding for this grant program comes from federal Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) funds administered to DCJS by the U.S. Department of Justice’s Office for Victims of Crime. In addition to federal funds, state general funds, and Virginia Crime Victim-Witness Fund special funds also support this grant program.

**No applications were denied.** One applicant’s requested amount was reduced as they requested \$8.00 more than the maximum allowable award amount. Additionally, the requested amounts of nine (9) applicants were increased as they mistakenly requested incorrect amounts in their initial applications. During the negotiation and verification process, their requested amounts were updated to reflect the correct maximum allowable award amounts.

Requested items for funding include, but are not limited to, personnel expenses, supplies, travel costs, and emergency assistance for victims of crime. Services provided by these funded projects include victim advocacy, criminal justice assistance, court accompaniment, crisis intervention, referral information, and other related services.

In summary, **DCJS staff request approval for 115 grant awards for the 12-month period (7/1/2025-6/30/2026), totaling \$20,779,087**, comprised of federal VOCA funds, state general funds, and Virginia Crime Victim-Witness Fund special funds allocated for this purpose.
