The purpose of this grant funding opportunity is to provide applicants with an opportunity to increase program capacity, program acceptance rates, and graduation rates for recovery courts, behavioral health dockets, and veterans' treatment dockets (specialty dockets).

**Two (2) applications were denied** and deemed to be ineligible because they were not submitted by local governments.

Funds will be used to support personnel and consultants that provide direct services to the participants enrolled in the specialty docket programs, which will expand program capacity. Additionally, funding will be utilized for ancillary services such as housing support, vocational/educational services, and community collaboration activities.

In summary, **DCJS Staff request approval to fund two (2) grant applications for the 22-month period (9/1/2025-6/30/2027), totaling \$240,200**, using federal funds allocated for this purpose.

Initially unacknowledged, these complementary supports are now deemed essential for the recovery journey, including housing assistance, vocational, educational, life skills counseling, and medical/dental care. To minimize financial barriers to recovery through participation in DPTC, the city seeks \$90,200 for a 22-month period, addressing costs like insurance gaps and housing support. This aims to stabilize participants for up to 90 days, promoting sustained recovery and community success.

Both courts are still young but growing in momentum and producing wonderful results. With this funding we will increase capacity of staff, increase graduation rates and increase program acceptance in the community by reducing stigma. Funding will be used for evidence-based staff trainings and conferences, educational and recreational programs for participants, and media campaigns to educate the community about the need for and success of recovery courts.

Attending RISE24 as treatment court team had an incredibly positive and significant impact on our team cohesion and on our overall operations as a program. These funds would support continued training and growth as a program for our case manager, coordinator, peer support, clinician, Judge, substance use treatment supervisor, and DSS representatives. Our second goal is to be able to directly fund outstanding ancillary needs that keep participants from meaningfully engaging in the program. Our third goal is to start a self-sustaining alumni group that will have a positive impact on both past and current participants.
