The purpose of the Virginia Sexual and Domestic Violence Victim Fund (VSDVVF) Grant Program is to make funds available to local prosecutors for the cost of attorneys and/or to further dedicate resources to prosecute felonies and misdemeanors involving domestic violence, sexual violence/abuse, stalking, and family abuse. In addition, this grant program supports projects that provide advocacy and medical services to victims of and/or children affected by domestic violence, sexual violence/abuse, stalking, and family abuse. This grant program is supported by state funds and was established in *Code of Virginia* § 9.1-116.1.

One (1) application was denied during the preliminary review as the applicant was not eligible to apply, since this funding opportunity was only open for current FY2025 VSDVVF grantees and not open to new applicants. The requested amounts of two (2) applicants were increased as they mistakenly requested incorrect amounts in their initial applications. During the negotiation and verification process, their requested amounts were updated to reflect the correct maximum total award amounts.

The requests for funding will support personnel expenses for prosecutors, advocates, legal services, forensic nurse examiner (FNE) salaries and FNE equipment, and culturally specific services to underserved populations including counseling, shelter placement, and outreach.

In summary, DCJS staff request approval to fund 49 grant applications for the 12-month period (7/1/2025-6/30/2026), totaling \$2,259,760, using state general and special funds allocated for this purpose.

The Virginia Sexual Domestic Violence Victims Fund (VSDVVF) will be used to support the personnel costs of a part-time attorney to prosecute misdemeanors and felonies involving domestic violence, sexual abuse, stalking and family abuse. It is estimated that 250 cases will be prosecuted with support from the VSDVVF from July 1, 2025 to June 2026. A portion of the award will also be used to support training and associated costs for program personnel.	Funds from the VSDVVF will be used to support a dedicated full-time prosecutor to handle both misdemeanor and felony cases involving domestic violence, sexual assault and abuse, stalking, and family-related crimes. In addition, the funding will be used to support training for project staff and other staff of the Commonwealth Attorney's Office to strengthen the prosecution of the above mentioned crimes.	Historically, Southside Medical Center (SMC) and Southern Virginia Medical Center have lacked forensic nursing services. These two hospitals are now Bon Secours Richmond Health System hospitals. Following the merger of the hospitals, Bon Secours began to assess the community's need for forensic medical exams. Accordingly, the Bon Secours Violence Response Team has expanded onsite forensic nursing care at SMC. We seek seed funding for two of the four full-time, on-duty SANE forensic nurse FTEs for the 12-month performance period of this VSDVVF grant opportunity. Bon Secours is confident that the Violence Response Team in Petersburg is strategically important and necessary.	Funds from the Virginia Sexual and Domestic Violence Fund will be used to fully support the personnel costs of a Paralegal to assist in the prosecution of misdemeanors and felonies involving domestic violence, sexual abuse, stalking and family abuse cases. Bedford County relies on this grant to cover a paralegal's salary and some benefits that works in the office of the Commonwealth's Attorney.	VSDVVF grants funds will be used to pay the salary of one RN-SANE trained provider to deliver forensic medical exams and provide training to staff in rural and underserved Southwest Virginia. Services will be based at Emergency Departments at Ballad Health hospitals including screening victims to rule out acute need, providing comfort, and performing SANE exams on-site for medical intervention and/or collecting evidence for law enforcement. The RN-SANE will work with law enforcement to direct victims to the appropriate facility for treatment; standardize follow up care; be the community liaison with Family Justice Centers; collaborate with existing community teams; and provide outreach.	Augusta Health Forensic Nursing Services is a well-established hospital-based program that has extended its services to the community. The program features a dedicated forensic exam room in Lexington, which offers acrue sexual assault exams for individuals of all ages, as well as non-acute scheduled exams specifically for pediatric patients and evaluations that include evidence collection. In 2024, a second offsite exam space was opened at the local child advocacy center, designed for non-acute exams of children following forensic interviews or referrals from surrounding counties. This initiative aims to secure funding for salary of a Forensic Nurse to staff these facilities and equipment upgrade. Services will be provided to 150 victims.	Funds from the Virginia Sexual and Domestic Violence Victim Fund will be used to support the personnel costs of a prosecutor to prosecute misdemeanors and felonies involving domestic violence, sexual abuse, stalking, and family abuse. Without these funds this rural community would not be able to prosecute many of these cases. This grant allows Appomattox County to combat increasing domestic violence and sexual assault crimes. The grant provides our office with a dedicated domestic violence prosecutor that is trained in victim centered approaches and outcomes. This project is critical to serving victims in our community.	Provide one 23-hour per week domestic violence court advocate to assist 275 victims seeking assistance to obtain a Preliminary Protective Order and court accompanying to 300 victims to their protective order and criminal cases against their abuser. Funds will be used to support the personnel costs of a single attorney specializing in the prosecution of domestic violence and sexual assault. In addition to prosecuting the incidents of these crimes in court, this position will also be responsible for training law enforcement officers in the community and other attorneys in the office. Additionally, the position will act as the office's representative in the community educating citizens and partnering with community stake holders to advance and promote community protection, positive rehabilitation, and successful outcomes in incidents of domestic violence and sexual assault.	VSDVVF grant funds will be used to pay the salaries and fringe for 13 FNEs who will provide compassionate, appropriate, trauma-based forensic care to adult and pediatric survivors of sexual assault/physical abuse. Funding will be used to maintain access and reduce barriers to forensic care to approximately 130 adults/children by maintaining the hours of on-site SANE services at Inova FACT Loudoun Cornwall Hospital and Inova FACT Alexandria locations during this grant period.	VSDVVF grant funds will be used to pay the salaries of 1 attorney. The VDVVF attorney will prosecute crimes of violence against women and sexual assaults against men, women, and children. Prosecutable crimes include Violation of Protective Orders, rape, sodomy, object sexual penetration, aggravated sexual battery, sexual battery, indecent liberties, and child pornography. The prosecutor will work closely with Hampton Police Division, as well as other law enforcement and medical personnel (e.g., SANE nurses). Furthermore, the prosecutor will coordinate and serve as a member of the Sexual Assault Response Team (SART) as required by Code.	The prosecutor funded by the grant handles domestic violence cases from first inception to final outcome. He provides advice to sheriff's office personnel to assist in developing prosecutable domestic violence cases to result in appropriate outcomes. He meets with victims prior to trial with the victim/witness advocate to prepare them for trial and to ensure that their voices are heard. He communicates with local domestic violence shelter staff as needed making referrals as necessary. He ensures that laws are followed and seeks justice consistent with ethical requirements. This project will serve victims of domestic violence and sexual assault in the jurisdiction of New Kent by prosecuting offenders. It is anticipated that the program will prosecute 100 cases and 140 charges in FY26. It is anticipated the domestic violence prosecutor will work with the Victim Witness program and other community agencies who serve victims.	Our office participates in the prosecution of all felony and misdemeanor crimes punishable by incarceration that occur in Mecklenburg County. This includes crimes that are sexual and/or domestic in nature, from the time that we first obtain information that a crime of domestic or sexual violence has occurred, whether that information comes from our law enforcement partners, the community at large, or by simply receiving a copy of a criminal complaint that was sworn out by a violian, the grant funded attorney seeks a better understanding of the case so that the ends of justice can better be served.	VSDVVF funds will be allocated to personnel costs of an Assistant Commonwealth's Attorney assigned to prosecute criminal charges involving VSDVVF priority offenses. The prosecuting attorney will not only represent the Commonwealth in court for these prosecutions, but will also continue to partner with local agencies to ensure a robust community responses to these criminal acts. The VSDVVF prosecutor will serve as the coordinator of the county's Multi-Disciplinary Team, which convenes to perform case review over VSDVVF cases. Consistent with past years, we anticipate VSDVVF funds to serve approximately 45 or more victims in grant-supported prosecutions, along with other victims whose cases may not have been referred for court prosecution.	VSDVVF's will be used to support the personnel costs of a full-time Domestic & Sexual Violence Legal Assistant to enhance existing resources in the successful prosecution of all misdemeanor and felony domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking, and family abuse cases within the Lynchburg Domestic & Sexual Violence Prosecution Team and the City of Lynchburg. From 7/1/24 to 4/01/25 (9 months), 414 cases were opened and prosecuted through the support of the VSDVVF. It is estimated that 625 cases will be opened and prosecuted from 7/1/25 to 6/30/26.	This grant will be used to fund a full-time attorney solely to prosecute misdemeanors and felonies involving domestic violence. In Stafford County we have seen a significant rise in domestic and sexual violence cases for the calendar year 2024.
