Re: Peer-Support Critical Incident Stress Management Grant Program for FY25

The Peer-Support Critical Incident Stress Management Grant Program for FY25, makes state funds available to support nonprofit organizations providing post-critical incident seminars and peer-supported critical incident stress management programs to law enforcement agencies and their staffs.

You have before you the proposed budget for the Peer-Support Critical Incident Stress Management Grant Program for FY243, totaling \$300,000, funding 2 grantees. This a continuation grant, in the fourth year of a four (4) year cycle, originally awarded for FY22.

The grant period for these awards would be from July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025.

This budget funds both agencies previously awarded this four-year grant.

In summary, DCJS staff request approval to fund 2 awards, totaling \$300,000, through the Peer-Supported Critical Incident Stress Management Grant Program.
