The purpose of the School Resource Officer/School Security Officer Incentive Grant Program is to provide funding for School Resource Officer (SRO) positions in Virginia public schools. School Resource Officer positions provide law enforcement and security services to schools across the Commonwealth. Funding is authorized under §9.1-110 of the *Code of Virginia*.

The FY 2027 SRO Incentive Grant Program will continue funding for currently active SRO grants. The recommended funding includes current fiscal year grants that are in their first through fifth year of funding. However, based on the final state budget, there may be adjustments made to the final awards for fifth-year grant applications.

Approval of this funding request will provide continuation funding for 100 current SRO grants.

In summary, DCJS staff request approval to fund 100 grant applications for the 12-month period (07/01/2026 - 06/30/2027) totaling \$21,200,745, using \$13,886,291 from the SRO/SSO Incentive Grant Program and \$7,314,454 in required subrecipient provided match.
