Purpose of Funding

The Department of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) administers general appropriations funds to support the Addiction Recovery Grant Program (ARGP). The Appropriation Act states that the four pilot ARGP programs that were chosen in consultation with the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services shall not receive grants for more than \$38,400 each.

The purpose for ARGP is to develop and maintain a model addiction recovery program in local or regional jails. The programs are based on best practices in existing research, related standards developed for substance use disorder treatment and criminal justice programming, and practices identified by experienced practitioners that are effective interventions in criminal justice settings.

Number applications received + total amount requested

For Fiscal Year 2024, DCJS staff received four applications totaling \$153,600.

Grant Project Description

The Bridging the Gap program is one of structure and discipline that assists the offender to work through his addiction problems while in custody in order to prepare them for re-entry into the community. The program involves a three-step program over the course of 6 months for a class size of 4-8 offenders. The program begins with the offender Finding his Identity, followed by a portion that involves life skills building in order to begin re-entry into the community, and ending with a phase that is having the offender become service oriented by working within the community. The largest goal for this program is to assist the offender to overcome his addiction and to prepare to be re-entered into society.

Grant Project Description

Upon release from incarceration, individuals with substance abuse disorders are eligible for services under Community Crossroads to continue substance abuse treatment and wrap around re-entry services to improve their chances of remaining in their communities as productive, crime-free and drug-free citizens. All participants of Community Crossroads are required to participate in the jail's post-release re-entry program and are assessed using an evidence-based tool designed to assess an offender's likelihood of criminological behavior. They are assigned a re-entry case manager who coordinates services such as housing, transportation, counseling, Medicaid, job readiness training and preparation, family unification and other services.

Project Performance to Date (if Continuation)

The Community Crossroads Program reduces recidivism by providing safe housing, counseling and substance abuse treatment of recently released individuals from the Newport News City Jail (NNCJ) and other approved drug treatment programs.

Grant Project Description

This program is a continuation of the current Addictions Recovery Grant Program. The program will provide reentry and recovery services to offenders who are within 60-120 days of release. The program will provide support services using the peer-recovery approach. These services will address substance use, offender re-entry (job readiness skills, trauma, family matters, domestic violence, finance, and budgeting), with the understanding that some collaboration will be through Zoom due to the Covid-19 pandemic. The program will continue to provide the continuum of care model.

Re: 504124-FY24 American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Grant Program

Purpose of Funding

The ARPA Law Enforcement Equipment and Technology Grant Program was created by the Virginia General Assembly to make one-time grants to state and local law enforcement agencies located in the Commonwealth, including colleges and universities, and, local and regional jails, for the purpose of training and purchasing equipment and supplies to support law enforcement related activities excluding equipment from which one time equipment grants were appropriated from the General Assembly in item 406 chapter 552 2021 Acts of the Assembly. This item refers to the state funding of \$6.5 million allocated to support Body Worn Cameras and related equipment needs.

In December, the Board approved twelve awards to twelve localities through this program. At that time, the four localities now being presented were allocated an allowable budget amount of \$750,000. However, they were awarded less due to a budget that included items that were not allowed, either by Code language or through a decision by DCJS.

This grant is intended specifically to support local Court Appointed Special Advocate programs as specified in §§9.1-151 et seq. of the Code of Virginia. Funds are to be used for purposes of continuing, improving, and/or expanding existing agencies and services designed to provide court appointed volunteer advocacy services to child victims of abuse and neglect.

Purpose of Funding

The Department of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) administers general appropriation funds designated for the purpose of supporting the Comprehensive Community Corrections Act for Local-Responsible Offenders (CCCA) and the Pretrial Services Act (PSA) as discretionary grants to local units of government. Only county or city governments that currently receive funds are eligible to receive CCCA and PSA grants. Each applicant is required to have an active Community Criminal Justice Board (CCJB) to serve as an advisory body to the local governing body on matters pertaining to local criminal justice issues. The composition of the CCJB is specified in §9.1-178 of the *Code of Virginia*.

CCCA/PSA were created to provide an alternative sentencing option for individuals convicted of certain misdemeanors or non-violent felonies for which sentences would be 12 months or less in a local or regional jail. Local community-based probation agencies provide services or referrals to services to include community service, assessment, education and/or treatment, and substance abuse testing.

Number applications received + total amount requested

For Fiscal Year 2024, DCJS staff received thirty-seven applications totaling \$30,136,780.

There were no applications denied.
