Purpose of Funding

The purpose of the Victims Services Grant Program (VSGP) is to support the delivery of direct services to victims of crime. The majority of funding for this grant program comes from federal Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) funds, administered by the U.S. Department of Justice's Office for Victims of Crime. These awards include funding for sexual assault and domestic violence core services. In accordance with VOCA guidelines, direct services to victims of crime include efforts that:

1. "respond to the emotional, psychological, or physical needs of crime victims;
2. assist victims to stabilize their lives after victimization;
3. assist victims to understand and participate in the criminal justice system; OR
4. restore a measure of security and safety for the victim."

Number applications received and total amount requested

This is a 12-month continuation for current VSGP subrecipients. DCJS received 96 applications totaling \$25,074,192. As this is a continuation grant, zero applications were denied.

Summary - request/recommendation to Committee

In summary, DCJS staff request approval to fund 96 projects for the 12-month period (7/1/2023–6/30/2024), **totaling \$25,074,192**, using VOCA funds (\$22,641,300) and State General Funds (\$2,432,892) allocated for this purpose.

The project staff also collaborates with multi-agency teams to identify and address gaps in service provision to victims of crime in Norfolk.

Grant Project Description

Project COURAGE receives referrals for students in 5th-8th grade, their siblings and students in the nontraditional programs who have been the victims of physical, or sexual abuse, physical bullying, stalking, or witnessed domestic violence. Children go through a series of assessments and are assigned a worker who supports them in developing coping skills and encourages them to attend school daily and put their best effort in at school. Students are able to access a trauma yoga instructor and also a mentor if their parents sign additional permissions. Parents are given parenting support and also support in ensuring that their child's basic needs are met. Workers attend court with the children/parents as requested.

Project Performance to Date (if Continuation)

Project COURAGE has served 78 students so far this school year. There are 69 enrolled now. We provide weekly support to students and at least monthly to parents. Many students have shown improvement in their grades, attendance is "iffy" for some.

Grant Project Description

VSGP grant funds will be used to pay the salaries (or partial salaries) of 12 staff and support hours from a pool of Relief Staff. These staff will provide counseling services, crisis intervention (including local hotline coverage), hospital and court accompaniment, Lethality Assessment Program coordination, and other client assistance. Funds will also be used for outreach activities throughout the five-jurisdiction service area. We anticipate serving 630 victims (as outlined in the goals/objectives) and providing crisis intervention to an additional 2,000 hotline callers during this grant period.

In 2022, the WRC met all goals and objectives in the VSGP funded project - except one. Other than the number of groups (lower than expected due to COVID), all victim services goals were met or surpassed.

Grant Project Description

YWCA Richmond's Sexual and Domestic Violence Services program serves survivors of current and/or domestic/intimate partner violence in the Greater Richmond region. The program serves survivors of all genders, ages, races/ethnicities, gender identities, socio-economic statuses and religions. We provide hotline crisis response, emergency and extended-stay housing, hospital accompaniment, emergency housing and financial assistance when needed, individual and group therapy, and individual specialized services for housing and employment. We will serve approximately 2,000 survivors per year with the services described in this grant.

Grant Project Description

YWCA of Central Virginia's Victim Services Programs, DVPP and SARP, provide comprehensive and direct services to domestic violence and sexual assault victims in Central Virginia. It is estimated that for FY24 (7/1/23-6/30/24), DVPP will provide direct victim services to 15,000 unduplicated victims. During FY22, DVPP answered 8,329 hotline calls and provided over 4,366 nights of safe shelter. During the same time period, SARP provided services to over 5,603 victims, including providing a total of 3,615 hotline and advocacy services to child sexual abuse and assault victimization. Our programs provide services to victims in six counties and the City of Lynchburg.
