**Domestic Violence** is a pattern of physically, sexually, and/or emotionally abusive behaviors used to by one individual to assert power or maintain control over another in the context of an intimate or family relationship. Misdemeanor and felony **domestic violence offenses** include any assaults, battery, vandalism, breaking and entering, or other offenses that occurred between two individuals as part of a pattern of domestic violence, as defined above. The Code of Virginia does not have to name the offense "domestic violence" for it to be counted on this form. Similarly, **sexual assault** and **stalking** offenses should be counted, even if other names are used for these types of offenses, such as "sexual battery" or "harassment."
