Domestic Violence is a pattern of physically, sexually, and/or emotionally abusive behaviors used by one individual to assert power or maintain control over another in the context of an intimate or family relationship. Misdemeanor and felony domestic violence offenses include any assaults, battery, vandalism, breaking and entering, or other offenses that occurred between two individuals as part of a pattern of domestic violence, as defined above. The Code of Virginia does not have to name the offense "domestic violence" for it to be counted on this form. Similarly, **sexual assault** and **stalking** offenses should be counted, even if other names are used for these types of offenses, such as "sexual battery" or "harassment."
