"Nitazenes" are powerful lab -made opioids, such as metonitazene and isotonitazene, with no approved medicaluse.

They are potentially 40 times stronger than fentanyland are difficult to detect through standard drug tests or testing strips.

Keep calm

Avoid misinformation

Resist getting drawn in to panic / over-dramatization

Self-care and staff-care

Focus on connection

Connection is the opposite of addiction

Connection is also the antidote to trauma

Stay the course

Consistency is key

It works if you work it

What message do we want to send?

- Every student is a valued member of the school community
- Health and well being is our priority
- Avoid fear -based tactics
- Remove stigmatizing language
- Positive social norming
- Target a wide audience
- Help is available and easy to access

Parallel Process for Schools & Families

- Health-focused
- Talk early and often
- Reduce shame & stigma
- Structure
- Accountability
- Connection
- Reduce barriers to help-seeking

- Morning announcements
- Interactive campaigns
- Signage
- Staff introductions / trusted adults
- PEER, student mentors
- Social media



GOOD SAMARITAN LAWS

§ 18.2-251.03. Arrest and prosecution when experiencing or reporting overdoses.

Protects against arrest or prosecution for unlawful purchase, possession, or consumption of alcohol, marijuana or a controlled substance or paraphernalia.



a person is experiencing an "Overdose":

IF . . .

life -threatening condition resulting from the consumption or use of alcohol and/or a controlled substance.

AND . . .

they or another person seeks emergency medical attention from:

- EMS, fire fighter, LE or 911

AND . . .

The person remains at the scene or at any alternative location until a law-enforcement officer responds.
