These enhanced, intensive services will now be provided to those at higher risk upon release, and occurred as a result of diligent work by OAR staff to build stronger relationships with the VADOC prison and community corrections staff.

### Grant Project Description

Provide reentry services through pre release programs at the Albemarle/Charlottesville Regional Jail and the Central Virginia Regional Jail and provide post release services for offenders once released from jail or prison. OAR serves 9 jurisdictions and the target population are those incarcerated preparing for release in the local jails and those who are released from jail/prison returning to the areas served. Budget requests include personnel, travel, equipment maintenance, and supplies.

### Project Performance to Date (if Continuation)

OAR-Jefferson Area is performing well, meeting or exceeding nearly all targets set for FY15. 54 inmates have participated in the evidence-based program Thinking for a Change pre-release, and 343 were provided community information. Post release services provided include 159 clients assessed, 253 receiving referrals to services, 251 participating in Life Skills programming, 236 provided with transportation assistance, 125 provided vital records, 76 received clothing assistance, 68 received housing assistance, and emergency food assistance to 31 supplemented by participation in SNAP-ET. Job readiness and employment services have been slightly below target with 134 receiving job readiness skills, intensive employment assistance to 163, and 87 clients were provided employment placement.
