The objectives of the program are to increase attendance, reduce referrals to the juvenile justice system and reduce suspensions and or expulsions. The City of Charlottesville has implemented Check and Connect in elementary and upper elementary schools. Budget supports the full time Check and Connect counselor, travel, training, office supplies, monthly computer charge s and incentives.

Grant Project Description

Loudon County Public Schools (LCPS) is requesting funding to expand its use of Restorative Practices (RP) that is integrated with its School Wide Positive Behavior Intervention (SWPBIS). SWPBIS has three tiers (primary prevention, secondary prevention, and tertiary prevention) that address school climate, reduces disciplinary actions, and increases instructional time. LCPS is Virginia's largest public school system (89 schools). Currently the SWPBIS and Restorative Practices approach is used in 28 schools as a 3 year pilot program at targeted schools. Integrating Restorative Practices with SWPBIS will encourage the development and use of conflict mediation skills and emotional literacy that improve school climates and a reduction of juvenile justice contact and involvement, and disproportionate suspensions and expulsions. The trained facilitators will then be able to offer Tier 1 and 2 prevention and intervention to administrators and designated school based staff. RP includes a continuum of services that are useful in all three tiers. Funding is requested to support training for 45 RP Conference facilitators to receive RP language and Circle training, train 12 certified conference facilitators to receive train the trainers (TOT) Language and Circle training.

Two mental health assessments are administered at during intake, the MAYSI and the ACLSA. Youth who are selected will participate in a life coaching session and complete a life coaching assessment. Case plans are developed that include service recommendations on the length and nature of the family and life coaching services. For each participant a maximum of three hours of service will be conducted each week within the facility for at least four weeks. Participants will receive a minimum of 12 hours of life coaching services to be conducted individual over four weeks, longer for youth who have longer sentences. Individual and family services will be provided by New River Valley Community Services, National Counseling Group and Family Preservation Services.

The objectives are to increased knowledge regarding human trafficking, identify at least 200 individuals who have been victimized, provide case management services for a minimum of twenty individuals for service provided by community partners. The program proposes to use community based presentations targeted for students, parents, teachers and the general public alerting them about the warning signs and potential dangers of trafficking. Trafficking prevention lessons will be conducted with all ninth grade students (7,300) throughout the Prince William County Public School System. Pre- and Post-test will be administered randomly selected classroom s to determine the to ascertain the students' knowledge of trafficking where human trafficking occurs, the different type of trafficking, who trafficking victims are and how to protect themselves from trafficking. Restoration activities involve providing support, including trauma informed services for victims of exploitation, who are come forward as a result of presentations, and classroom lectures.
