### Grant Project Description

The Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) will partner with Assisting Families of Inmates (AFOI) to replicate the Resilience Trumps ACEs Framework in the East End area of Richmond. The Resilience Trumps ACES (RTA) is a program that mobilizes the community through dialogue to reduce the number of adverse childhood experiences while building resilience and a more effective service delivery system. DJJ will develop the Richmond Resilience Network and will provide programming or ten families of youth committed to DJJ under parole supervision, aged 17 or under and identified as possibly "gang affiliated". DJJ and AOFI will select a community resident to serve as a consultant tasked with organizing the project within the community. The partnership will also convene city agencies including social services, schools, mental health agencies, and the faith community. DJJ will seek the advice and support of the Chief Judge of the Richmond Juvenile Court. RTA will provide two days of on-site training with families and community professionals and follow up with webinars, and bi-weekly phone consultation for 8 weeks.

### Grant Project Description

The James River Detention Home (JRDH) is requesting funding to implement the evidenced based programs Aggression Replacement Training (ART), and Skill Streaming. JRDH will purchase computer tablets that will be loaded with ART and Skill Streaming software. Both programs will be delivered to youth in the Post Dispositional program or the reentry program who are placed for 2- 6 months in the JRDH. ART promotes pro social behavior in chronically aggressive and violent adolescents using techniques that develop social skills, emotional control and moral reasoning. Skill Streaming employs a four-part training approach that models role-playing, performance feedback, and generalization to teach essential pro social skills to children and adolescents.

## Grant Project Description

The Middle Peninsula Juvenile Detention Commission is requesting JABG funding to purchase computer tablets and other equipment to support the accountability based programs that have been developed to reduce recidivism, and behavioral health issues of residents. The Merrimac Juvenile Detention Center has adopted a behavior management system based on Cognitive Behavior Training. Residents are graded during the day on six areas of behavior on their own individual point sheet and get constant specific feedback on their behavior through a point system. Staff members carry individual point sheets from classroom to classroom and between units (typically 9 times a day). Tallying and carrying point sheets are cumbersome, time intensive and subject to errors. The purchase of computer tablets for each work team member will allow centralized access to point sheets and continue the progression toward a paperless environment. Currently, all other resident records are electronic.
