Funds from the VDSVVF will be used to support the personnel costs of a part-time attorney to further dedicate existing resources to prosecuting cases involving domestic violence, sexual abuse, stalking and family abuse. It is estimated that over one thousand cases will be prosecuted with the support from VDSVVF from 7/1/2015 to 6/30/2016.

### Project Performance to Date (if Continuation)

A total of 179 cases have been prosecuted by funded attorney from 7/1/2016 to 3/31/2017.
