The project will support personnel and associated program costs for a full time Coordinator of Volunteer Services who will be dedicated to Pittsylvania County to recruit, train and supervise 6 - 8 new CASA volunteers who will serve an additional 15 - 20 abused and neglected child victims. One new, previously unserved locality will be served by this project.

Grant Project Description

Children's Trust Roanoke serves the 23rd Judicial District and seeks to expand services to Botetourt County in the 25th Judicial District. Children's Trust CASA has discussed the possibility of program expansion with the CASA program currently serving in the 25th District. This program has no plans to serve Botetourt County and supports the Children's Trust effort to expand. The project will support personnel and associated program costs for a full time Supervisor/Recruiter/Trainer who will recruit, train volunteers, and focus on outreach throughout the entire Roanoke Valley including Botetourt and Craig Counties. A part time program supervisor will be hired to oversee up to 15 CASA volunteers. While the project anticipates training 30 new volunteers, only 5 children will be served from Botetourt County. The proposal does not indicate if any of the new volunteers will be recruited from the new locality. One new, previously unserved locality will be served by this project.

Staff Recommendation/Comments

Recommend not funding. The proposal did not meet eligibility criteria for the grant project, namely, to serve an unserved area. The funding request included expenditures for additional staff to primarily recruit new volunteers to serve new children from existing service areas the program currently covers. Only 5 new children from the new service area would be served from the \$73,040 funds requested. There was not a specific request for funding for the new service area. Therefore, a reduction in the amount requested could not be made in order to fund the request only the portion going to the new service area.

Recommend not funding. The existing CASA program operates in the 28th Judicial District, serving the city of Bristol and Washington and Smyth counties. The proposed expansion would serve Culpeper County which is 300 miles from Bristol. The project did not include details for implementation of the project. The proposal did not describe how the existing CASA resources would be leveraged to implement the new expansion given the distance. Additionally, there are several unserved areas near Bristol. It is unclear why the organization opted to select Culpeper as the site for expansion.
