## Grant Project Description

The City of Charlottesville, in partnership with Charlottesville City Schools, is requesting funding to continue the implementation of the Check and Connect Student Engagement Program. The program is designed to prevent truancy and early school withdrawal with the objectives of reducing delinquency and disproportionality in the local juvenile justice system for students in the 8th-10th grades. The program addresses school behavior and attendance issues at Charlottesville High School and Buford Middle School. The Check and Connect Coach works with 20 students and their families who are referred to the program by school attendance teams.

## Project Performance to Date (if Continuation)

There has been an overall increase in school attendance for 10 students of 46%; increases for individual students range from 35%-65%. Of the students referred to the Check and Connect Program, none had new referrals to the juvenile justice system. 80% (8 of 10) of the students referred to the Check and Connect Program had no new out-of-school suspensions or expulsions in the second quarter. Comparison data for three new referrals will be reviewed at the end of the next school semester. In the other quarters, there were no school suspensions or expulsions. The "Coach" regularly meets with each school's referral team; has individual meetings with both school administrations; and has attended school staff meetings. The "Coach" met with the referred students and their families weekly or in some cases two times per week or daily, if needed.

### Grant Project Description

The Department of Juvenile Justice is requesting continuation funding to provide training for DJJ line and supervisory staff in the court service unit setting. Approximately 60 additional staff from Court Service Units in Virginia Beach and Richmond will be trained in Effective Practices in Community Supervision (EPICS). Funding for this project will allow the agency to provide booster training for DJJ staff previously trained and certified to deliver the EPICS Curriculum. The EPICS Train the Trainer Booster Course will be provided for staff members who have been selected to be DJJ trainers so that the agency can sustain an effective EPICS training capacity. The curriculum has been updated and three DJJ staff who served as trainers have either left the Department or have been transferred to other units.

### Project Performance to Date (if Continuation)

The overall goal for this grant-funded project was to increase fidelity to evidence-based principles intended to improve outcomes and reduce recidivism. The primary objective of providing training to 60 court service unit staff on individual cognitive behavioral interventions learned through a training course called EPICS – Effective Practices in Effective Supervision (EPICS) was accomplished. A Memorandum of Agreement was completed between University of Cincinnati Corrections Institute and DJJ in March. Training for the Southern region was held on April 10, 11, and 12, 2018 EPICS End training for the Eastern region was held on April 11, 12, and 13, 2018 at DJJ’s 4th District Court Service Unit, in Norfolk, VA. A total of sixty probation and parole officers participated in the three day training. In addition to the onsite training, audio tape submissions by participants were reviewed by the consultants, including coaching using video feedback sessions.

### Grant Project Description

### Grant Project Description

The Patrick County Commonwealth's Attorney Office will continue employing a specialized prosecutor to pursue evidence based prosecutions in cases of domestic violence, sexual assault, and other "victimless" cases where the victim is reluctant, recanting, or unavailable; who will promote victim safety as well as offender accountability; who will receive specialized training in such prosecutions; who will teach officers how to conduct investigations with an evidence based prosecution in mind.

### Project Performance to Date (if Continuation)

All efforts to fulfill grant goals and objectives have been achieved from 10/1/2017 to 6/30/2018. No performance issues noted. The funded position has documented an increase in conviction rates, up 3.7% from last funding cycle. The funded position attributes trainings received and provided to allied professional for the increased success of evidence based prosecutions. Specifically the implementation of a strangulation checklist to be used by responding officers and Kids in Court (program designed to prepare children for the court experience).

### Grant Project Description

Family Services of Roanoke Valley (FSRV) is requesting funding to continue the implementation of the Positive Action Program in the City of Roanoke. The Positive Action program is led by FSRV staff with youth who reside in five Roanoke Redevelopment and Housing sites. Positive Action is an evidence-based prevention program that enhances academic achievement, family relationships, promotes violence prevention, and substance use avoidance. The objectives of the program are to strengthen school, community, family, and individual protective factors. Positive Action also increases parent and youth knowledge regarding the risks of substance abuse and early sexual behavior.

### Project Performance to Date (if Continuation)

78 children have been provided evidence based curricular groups in their public housing neighborhood's community rooms. An average of 10 groups per neighborhood for an average of 45 minutes per group, or 7.5 hours of programming were provided each quarter. Throughout the grant year, 159 children have been provided programming for an average of 20 groups per child, or 15 hours of programming per child. Each staff member has received approximately 4 hours of training to provide the program in a culturally appropriate, evidence based method. Program goals and objectives were measured using the Pre/Post Surveys. The surveys indicated: increased student empathy, no additional alcohol or tobacco use, a decrease in frequent fighting, and increased anger control. The post tests indicated no increase in impulse control which indicates a skill for future program focus. The children who participated most often showed the most impact. Service activities have included: making placemats, and baking snacks for homeless shelters, making cards for children in the hospitals, and environmental clean-ups.
