CAPS of the Blue Ridge is an umbrella organization for the Franklin County CASA program that serves the 22nd Judicial District, including the town of Rocky Mount. In FY2018, the organization expanded its CASA services within the same judicial district, but into neighboring Pittsylvania County and within the town of Chatham. Second-year funding is requested to support the expansion project's continuing efforts of recruiting and training volunteer advocates, and developing an outreach campaign to educate and engage new community partners to support the success of the services. The project's FY2019 goals include the recruitment and training of six to eight new CASA volunteers, thereby increasing its capacity to serve an anticipated 10-12 new cases involving child victims of abuse and neglect.

Project Performance to Date (if Continuation)

The expansion project met its stated FY2018 goals of successfully establishing a physical office location and providing dedicated CASA services in the previously underserved localities. In previous years, CAPS of the Blue Ridge CASA had minimally served the court of the expansion areas with existing volunteers from Franklin County, while seeking funding for the full expansion of services. The full expansion has enabled the hiring of qualified staff that manage the expanded services, including the recruitment, training, and supervision of new CASA volunteers. The availability of the expanded CASA services has enabled the assignment of new cases involving child victims of abuse and neglect.
