An advocacy group goes further and creates a space where individual members not only glean support, but also gather tools to help themselves feel empowered to move forward in their lives. This group will decrease members' sense of isolation, provide emotional support, and encourage healthy coping strategies to deal with stressful life events. It will also work with members to be active participants in their own treatment, and expose them to community resources for which they can take advantage. By sharing their stories and feelings, group members learn that they are not alone and help one another to overcome feelings of frustration, loneliness, and despair. By learning about how to take advantage of the resources in their community, group members learn they do not have to be silent victims of a tormentor in their life.
