## Grant Project Description

SASP funding helps fund our Bilingual Specialist, who is the staff member providing support to our Spanish speaking clients. While this grant covers just over twenty-five percent of her time working with Hispanic/Latino clients, funding is vital to her providing services for 30 individuals experiencing some form of sexual assault crisis. Unfortunately, we anticipate those numbers staying the same for CY 2020. This is a very busy position providing individual and group support, referrals, education, court advocacy and hospital accompaniment for initial forensic exams. Her positive impact in the lives of this underserved population is a direct result of SASP funding. Additionally, we are looking to expand our services in response to a need in the community specifically for bilingual sexual assault support groups. PWC DSS already has eight families they can immediately refer to us for group support. ACTS Sexual Assault Services aims to provide as much support as a victim needs by providing gentle, trauma-informed guidance while they are on their healing journey. Additional funding would allow us to double the number of Hispanic/Latino clients served by offering these services. We are looking to hire four part-time Bilingual Sexual Assault/Abuse Group Facilitators (two for primary victims and two for secondary victims) to run weekly groups. SASP funding will directly support these services.

### Grant Project Description

SASP funds will support 482 victim advocate staff hours. It is estimated that between January 1, 2020 and December 31, 2020, the funded victim advocate will provide direct services to 45 new victims of sexual assault. Between January 1, and December 31, 2018, 79 victims were served through SASP funded services. Services will include: crisis intervention, personal advocacy (medical and criminal justice) and information and referrals. SASP grant funds will be used to supplement existing funds and will not replace or supplant funds that have been appropriated for the purpose of providing services to victims of sexual assault. Funds are requested for a part-time position to work after routine business hours. Services are currently provided in this context by staff on call. The frequency of calls results in service voids when called out workers utilize comp time to comply with hourly work limits as overtime funds are not available. This will result in an increase in the total number of staff hours devoted to provision of services to victims of sexual assault. Funding is also requested to replace an antiquated telephone system and to provide emergency food, supplies, daycare and shelter for victims and their children.
