Through education, peer support, recovery planning and evidenced-based programming to promote cognitive-behavioral change, Healthy Minds helps inmates understand and address their mental illness and make the long term changes necessary to become healthy & productive citizens after their release.

Healthy Minds will address the current lack of comprehensive education, therapeutic services, and peer support at WVRJ for the mentally ill, which negatively impacts individual inmates, the inmate population, and all of southwest Virginia.

Grant Project Description

Through a contract with Valley Community Services Board, MRRJ will continue to provide the services of 1 FTE Mental Health Re-Entry Case Manager and 2 FTE Master’s Level Clinicians to the inmate population. Special Needs Program Pods (one male/one female) will continue to provide safe and supportive housing within MRRJ for individuals diagnosed with Serious Mental Illness. Needs assessments are conducted & evidence based programming is provided to assist individuals assigned to the Special Needs Pods as they re-enter the community. Initial release services such as emergency housing, release medications, community referrals/transportation/services are provided until case management is established with local CSB providers.

Project Performance to Date (if Continuation)

Middle River Regional Jail (MRRJ) will continue to collect and report on a quarterly basis qualitative and quantitative data on site performance of the Jail Mental Health Program and mental health services provided to inmates at MRRJ.
