## Grant Project Description

Henrico County Sheriff's Office (HCSO) will complete a 6-month planning session and then begin their planned program at the beginning of month seven. HCSO program will provide substance use treatment and medication assisted treatment (MAT) using Sublocade, combined with counseling and cognitive behavioral therapy (CBT). Best practices will be used to effectively implement these programs along with the collaboration of jail security staff, mental health clinicians and medical providers. This process is meant to treat addiction from the disease model and utilize a holistic approach to improve an offender's physical and mental well-being to promote successful recovery upon re-entry into the community. This will be a planning/implementation hybrid grant for year one.

This program had an RSAT planning grant for FY21 but had difficulty meeting its goals for planning. It is currently continuing planning activities and will be moving into implementation during this first year of RSAT FY22 implementation award.

Western Virginia Regional Jail will provide substance abuse treatment and medication treatment (MAT) for participants in the RSAT-MAT program which includes a 16-week residential component.
