The Collins Center service area encompasses rurally-isolated persons and an extensive community of refugees, immigrants, and first-generation families with limited English proficiency and varying cultural norms. These guides would contain linguistically accessible referrals for victim services through Collins Center and a comprehensive list of community partners to address immediate and long-term needs of primary and collateral victims of sexual violence.

It is anticipated that between January 1, 2022- December 31, 2022, on-call staff will provide direct services to 35 new adult victims of sexual assault. Services will include: accompaniment, crisis intervention, personal advocacy, short term counseling, and information & referral services. SASP grant funds will be used to supplement existing funds and will not replace (supplant) nonfederal funds that have been appropriated for the purpose of providing services to victims of sexual assault. SASP funds will result in an increase in the total number of staff hours devoted to the provision of services to victims of sexual assault by this agency.

## Project Performance to Date (if Continuation)

Project Horizon has consistently met the grant goals and objectives of providing advocacy, accompaniment, and counseling for sexual assault victims.
