Re: Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (JJDP) – One Time

The 2023 Juvenile Justice One-Time Grant Program provides federal funds through the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (JJDP) Act Title II Formula Grants Program available to local units of government, state agencies, juvenile detention centers for one-time requests. The goal of this funding initiative is to provide applicants with an opportunity to request funds to enhance existing juvenile justice programs or projects, including initiatives to reduce youth gun violence. Funds awarded for this initiative may only be utilized for Consultants, Travel, Subsistence, Equipment, and/or Supplies and Other Expenses. Awards were considered on a competitive basis, and applicants were required address all the key components outlined in these grant guidelines to be eligible for consideration.

The Advisory Committee on Juvenile Justice, by virtue of the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act, must have the opportunity to review and comment on the applications received. They met November 18, 2022, to review the 12 applications received and to make recommendations on funding. Those recommendations will be presented to the full Criminal Justice Services Board on December 8.

The ACJJP is recommending approval of ten one-time grants, denial of one one-time grant, and approval of one two-year DCJS in-house grant.

Grant Project Description

Funding fully supports the salary and travel related expenses for the two staff members responsible for assuring Virginia's compliance with the core requirements of the JJDP Act, Jail Removal, Sight and Sound Separation, the Deinstitutionalization of Status Offenders and Racial and Ethnic Disparities. DCJS is required to make annual reports to the Administrator of the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention on the results of our monitoring and compliance efforts. The administrative funds available from OJJDP are not sufficient to fully staff the JJDP work.

Project Performance to Date (if Continuation)

The Compliance monitors conducted virtual site visits during this period. During the grant period local and state and facilities had not yet opened to allow site visits due to COVID protocols. Virtual visits were made to 19 court holding facilities, 25 jails, and 40 law enforcement lockups. The OJJDP Annual Report containing compliance data for FFY2021 was completed and submitted.

Grant Project Description

The Virginia Department of Juvenile Justice (VADJJ) proposes, in partnership with Assisting Families of Inmates (AFOI), to implement a secure, reliable, video visitation system at Bon Air Juvenile Correctional Center. Located in Chesterfield County, Bon Air houses justice-involved youth who are from all areas of our state, and whose families live in communities throughout our state and beyond; making visitation (transportation, fuel, lodging) difficult for those unable to travel. Video visitation, especially in situations like COVID, lockdowns and facility measures that impact in-person visitation, is a valuable tool in maintaining real-time, face-to-face family connectivity. Bon Air currently has no infrastructure for video visitation.

YWCA Richmond has been an active member of the collaborative efforts to provide crisis support services to survivors of sexual violence for over 40 years. In response to the growing and changing needs of sexual assault survivors in Richmond City and Chesterfield County, we will focus our project on expanding our Regional Hospital Accompaniment Response Team (RHART), allowing us to better meet the demand for skilled hospital advocates in local hospital systems. Increased resources focused on survivors of sexual violence will allow YWCA Richmond to provide resources to victims living at the intersection of poverty, race, and sexual violence through targeted bus ads and media campaigns.

The Virginia Sexual and Domestic Violence Victim Fund (VSDVVF) is a state special fund that was established by the Virginia General Assembly in 2004. The purpose of the VSDVVF is to address domestic violence, sexual violence, sexual abuse, stalking, and family abuse through victim services and prosecution efforts. Effective July 1, 2022, § 9.1-116.1 of the Code of Virginia was amended and reenacted to include the availability of funding for sexual assault service providers and hospitals for the purpose of funding the cost of salaries and equipment for sexual assault forensic examiners, sexual assault nurse examiners, and pediatric sexual assault nurse examiners. Over the 18-month period of January 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024, approximately \$1,000,000 has been allocated to support projects dedicated to providing sexual assault forensic examinations for victims of sexual assault.

This was newly established competitive funding opportunity. All applications and supplemental materials were submitted via the DCJS Online Grants Management System (OGMS). In total, DCJS received 13 applications. All the applications received a preliminary review to assess eligibility to apply by the Grant Program Coordinator. One applicant was ineligible to apply for funding. Twelve (12) eligible applications were then reviewed as a part of a competitive grant review process by review teams comprised of non-DCJS/external reviewers and DCJS staff. Reviewers considered demonstrated need, geographic location, budget justification, cost-effectiveness of proposed projects, and the availability of competitive funds when conducting their reviews. Reviewers also prioritized budgetary items that focused primarily on direct services for victims of sexual violence.

The requests for funds from the applicants exceeded the funds available for this grant program. Thus, applicants receiving a score of less than 50 points were not recommended for funding. The remaining projects each received a reduction of 4.25% from their recommended funding amounts.

In summary, DCJS staff **request approval to fund nine (9) projects** for the 18-month period (1/1/2023-6/30/2024), **totaling \$998,750**, using State General Funds allocated for this purpose.

The Improving Criminal Justice Response (ICJR) to Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, Sexual Assault, and Stalking Grant Program, administered by the Federal Office on Violence Against Women, was awarded to DCJS in the amount of \$1,000,000 for a three-year grant period.

DCJS is the state administering agency for ICJR, in partnership with the Office of the Attorney General, the Virginia Poverty Law Center, the Virginia Sexual and Domestic Violence Action Alliance, and the Virginia Victim Assistance Network. During this three-year award, funding will allow the ICJR partnership to provide technical assistance and training on best practices in sexual and domestic violence response and victim advocacy.

The focus area for this grant opportunity was for the purchase of equipment related to real time infrastructure and technology to support law enforcement response to violent crime. The total amount for funding is \$7,359,694.00. This funding opportunity was open to 12 eligible cities that were deemed to have been disproportionately affected by violent crime as reflected in the 2021 Incident Based Reporting (IBR) data. The cities that were identified were Chesapeake, Danville, Emporia, Hampton, Lynchburg, Martinsville, Newport News, Norfolk, Petersburg, Portsmouth, Richmond, and Roanoke.

These grants have an anticipated grant period of January 1, 2023 - June 30, 2023. This was a non-competitive grant process; however, all grant applications were reviewed, and reviewers' recommendations were considered when recommended funding was determined.

Option V Out of State Lateral Program Academy

Option V Academy's offer an abbreviated law enforcement training academy to officers sworn or previously sworn in other states, that would like to become a sworn officer in Virginia. The proposed budget of \$148,600 in ARPA funding would make awards to two localities (the cities of Fairfax and Virginia Beach) and would fund a total of 3 Option V Academy classes.

These grants have an anticipated grant period of January 1, 2023 - June 30, 2023. This was a noncompetitive grant process; however, all grant applications were reviewed and reviewers' recommendations were taken into account when recommended funding was determined.

Regional Criminal Justice Academy – Equipment

The purpose of the Hospital-Based Violence Intervention and Prevention Program (HVIP) is to continue and expand HVIP programs to provide services to victims of violent crime with the goal of reducing future incidences of violence-related injuries and homicides. HVIPs are multidisciplinary programs that combine the efforts of medical staff with trusted community-based partners to provide safety planning, services, and trauma-informed care to victims injured in gun violence and their families.

The Virginia Hospital and Healthcare Association Foundation (VHHAF) responded to the Hospital-Based Violence Intervention and Prevention Program Guidelines and Application to support HVIP programs in six Virginia Hospitals, Sentara Norfolk General (Norfolk), Riverside (Newport News), Virginia Commonwealth University (Richmond), Children's Hospital of the King's Daughters (Norfolk), Carilion Roanoke (Roanoke), and Bon Secours Southside (Petersburg). They were the only applicant. If awarded the HVIP will begin a 24 month grant cycle in SFY 2024. This grant program is supported with FVIPF funding and will run from July 1, 2023-June 30, 2025.

For the 24-month award period, VHHAF is requesting a total of \$5,000,000.

The Operation Ceasefire Fund was created by the Virginia General Assembly in Chapter 2 of the Acts of Assembly of the 2022 Special Session 1. This funding source “shall be used solely for the purposes of implementing violent crime reduction strategies, providing training for law-enforcement officers and prosecutors, providing equipment for law enforcement agencies, and awarding grants to organizations such as state and local law-enforcement agencies, local attorneys for the Commonwealth, localities, social services providers, and nonprofit organizations that are engaged in group violence intervention efforts. For the purposes of subsection N.2. of this item, ‘group violence intervention’ means comprehensive law enforcement, prosecutorial, and community-based initiatives, substantially similar to Operation Ceasefire as implemented in Boston, Massachusetts and the Gang Reduction Programs implemented in Richmond and Los Angeles, California, which are documented by the Department of Justice and are carried out between members of law enforcement, members of the community, and social services providers.”

DCJS received 30 applications in response to our grant solicitation, including two for the state agency portion of \$2,600,000, totaling \$9,838,566.

The Lee County Commonwealth's Attorney aims to reduce violent crime within the community by hiring an additional prosecutor to enforce the laws of the Commonwealth in cases tending to promote gun violence, such as violent crimes and methamphetamine trafficking. As many of these cases are complex and require specialized knowledge and experience, an additional prosecutor will ensure that they receive more time and attention. This includes prosecutions in Lee County, as well as prosecutions in surrounding counties when the Lee County Commonwealth's Attorney is appointed. The prosecutor will also review petitions for concealed carry and restoration of firearm rights and note objections in appropriate circumstances to prevent future violence.
