#### **Purpose of Funding**

The purpose of the Sexual Assault Services Program (SASP) is to support the establishment, maintenance, and expansion of rape crisis centers and other nongovernmental or tribal programs and projects to assist individuals who have been victimized by sexual assault, without regard to the age of the individual (34 U.S.C. §12511(b)(2)(B)). SASP funding originates from the U.S. Department of Justice's Office on Violence Against Women.

#### Number applications received and total amount requested

This State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2024 funding is a one-time competitive funding opportunity for a 12-month grant. DCJS received 26 applications with requests totaling \$516,816.

The requests for funds from the applicants exceeded the funds available to award, which total \$276,028. Applications were scored separately by two DCJS staff members. Twelve applications are not recommended for funding due to the lack of available funding and how their applications scored.

#### **Summary - request/recommendation to Committee**

In summary, DCJS staff request approval to fund 14 projects for the 12-month period (7/1/2023–6/30/2024), totaling \$276,028, using federal SASP funds designated for this purpose.
