Re: Victims Services Grant Program Applications for State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2024

Purpose of Funding

The purpose of the Victims Services Grant Program (VSGP) is to support the delivery of direct services to victims of crime. The majority of funding for this grant program comes from federal Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) funds, administered by the U.S. Department of Justice's Office for Victims of Crime. These awards include funding for sexual assault and domestic violence core services. In accordance with VOCA guidelines, direct services to victims of crime include efforts that:

- 1. "respond to the emotional, psychological, or physical needs of crime victims;
- 2. assist victims to stabilize their lives after victimization;
- 3. assist victims to understand and participate in the criminal justice system; OR
- 4. restore a measure of security and safety for the victim."

Number applications received and total amount requested

This is a 12-month continuation for current VSGP subrecipients. DCJS received 96 applications totaling \$25,074,192. As this is a continuation grant, zero applications were denied.

Summary - request/recommendation to Committee

In summary, DCJS staff request approval to fund 96 projects for the 12-month period (7/1/2023–6/30/2024), **totaling \$25,074,192**, using VOCA funds (\$22,641,300) and State General Funds (\$2,432,892) allocated for this purpose.

VOCA funds will enable the Sexual Assault Center (SAC) and Domestic Violence Program (DVP) to continue providing comprehensive services to 425 survivors of sexual violence (SA) and/or domestic violence (DV) during the grant period. In addition to providing advocacy to victims of violence, staff efforts will focus on recruiting and training volunteers who are representative of the demographics of the Alexandria community to assist with maintaining coverage for two 24-hour hotlines for the SAC and DVP and providing community education and awareness.
