Purpose of Funding

The Peer-Support Critical Incident Stress Management Grant Program for FY24, makes state funds available to support nonprofit organizations providing post-critical incident seminars and peer-supported critical incident stress management programs to law enforcement agencies and their staffs.

Number applications received + total amount requested

DCJS received two applications for FY243, totaling \$300,000. This a continuation grant, in the third year of a four (4) year cycle, originally awarded for FY22.

The grant period for these awards would be from July 1, 2023 – June 30, 2024.

Number applications denied

No applications were denied.

In summary, DCJS staff request approval to fund 2 awards, totaling \$300,000 through the Peer-Supported Critical Incident Stress Management Grant Program.
