Re: Calendar Year (CY) 2024-2025 Virginia Services, Training, Officers, and Prosecution (VSTOP) Grant Program

The VSTOP Grant Program is supported by federal Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) funds through the U.S. Department of Justice Office on Violence Against Women (OVW). The goals of the VSTOP program are to promote a coordinated, multidisciplinary approach to improving the criminal justice system's response to violent crimes against women; to encourage the development and strengthening of effective law enforcement and prosecution strategies to address violent crimes against women; and the development and strengthening of victim services in cases involving violent crimes against women.

Within the CY 2024-2025 funding opportunity, guidelines were drafted to conduct a comprehensive evaluation of long-standing VSTOP projects as well as offer a competitive application process to new applicants. The funding opportunity was open to current CY 2023 recipients under the VSTOP Grant Program, and new applicants were eligible to apply under two priority areas dedicated to increasing access to justice for all survivors of sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking. Applications were received via the DCJS On-Line Grants Management System (OGMS) and received a comprehensive review based on elements indicated within the grant guidelines. DCJS received 79 applications under this funding opportunity, and three were deemed ineligible to apply. Two continuation applicants formally indicated their intent not to apply (Commonwealth's Attorneys' Services Council and George Mason University). DCJS staff reviewed 76 eligible applications.

Due to the availability of funding, no applications were denied for funding. In summary, DCJS staff **request approval to fund 76 projects** for the 24-month period (1/1/2024-12/31/2025), **totaling \$8,211,923**, using federal STOP funds and program-provided matching funds allocated for this purpose. The total award is comprised of \$6,656,189 in federal STOP funds and \$1,555,734 of local matching funds.

Grant Project Description

It is estimated that services will be provided to 425 victims in each CY 2024-2025 by the Outreach Advocates providing services in City of Bristol VA and Washington County VA. Services provided will consist of safety planning, court accompaniment, advocacy, arranging emergency shelter, informamiton and referral, assistance with filing protective orders, applying for housing and providing trainings to professionals in the community. Approximately 200 participants will attend 10 trainings.

Project Performance to Date (if Continuation)

The Bristol VA & Washington County VA Outreach Advocates served 435 non duplicated victims, Jan-Dec 2022. Jan-June 2023, 265 victims were served and trainings were provided to 19 participants, 61 of which were law enforcement officers.

Grant Project Description

ACTS Sexual Assault Services is the only comprehensive services for victims of sexual assault in Prince William County. This VSTOP CY 24/25 project will partially fund three positions: Community Educator will be funded for 11.5 hours per week, Bilingual Sexual Assault Specialist will be funded for 11.5 hours per week, and a Sexual Assault Specialist which will be funded for 12.5 hours per week. These positions provide supportive sexual assault services such as individual and group support, as well as medical, legal, and law enforcement accompaniment for sexual assault victims and their families. Outreach activities will include educational trainings for professionals, staff, and volunteers as well as representation on local committees.

Project Performance to Date (if Continuation)

During the 2022 reporting period, our Community Educator participated in 41 events, reaching a total of 1,724 individuals. Approximately 67 primary victims were served by our Sexual Assault Specialists (23% of which were Spanish-speaking).

Grant Project Description

The Sexual Assault Center requests continued V-STOP funding for one Hispanic Human Services Specialist (HSS) to provide crisis intervention and criminal justice services. The HSS served 62 victims of sexual violence in CY2022. The Sexual Assault Center projects serving at least 75 adult Spanish-speaking sexual violence victims in CY 2024 and at least 75 adult Spanish-speaking sexual violence victims in CY 2025. This grant would also support the continuation of outreach services to the Hispanic/Latino community and participation in the Alexandria Sexual Assault Response Team.

Grant Project Description

The Domestic Violence Intervention Project (DVIP) is a multidisciplinary partnership which includes the ability to prosecute domestic violence (DV) and inter-personal violence cases (IPV) regardless of a victim's level of cooperation. DVIP is requesting funds for a full-time intervention specialist to provide system-based advocacy to these victims. As of July 1, 2023 (6-month mark), our current VSTOP grant (23-A9342VA21) has already served 199 victims of domestic violence, 32% of which are direct clients of our VSTOP-funded specialist. From the period of January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2025, we forecast that at least 300 victims will be served, and training provided to at least 75 allied professionals.

As of July 1, 2023 (6-month mark), our current VSTOP grant (23-A9342VA21) has already served 199 victims of domestic violence, 32% of which are direct clients of our VSTOP-funded specialist
