Re:	FY 2025 Edward Byrne Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) for DCJS Training

The Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) program is the leading source of federal justice funding to state and local jurisdictions. The JAG Program provides states, tribes, and local governments with critical funding necessary to support a range of program areas including law enforcement, prosecution, indigent defense, courts, crime prevention and education, corrections and community corrections, drug treatment and enforcement, planning, evaluation, technology improvement, crime victim and witness initiatives, mental health programs and related law enforcement and corrections programs, including behavioral programs and crisis intervention teams, and implementation of state crisis intervention court proceedings and related programs or initiatives including, but not limited to, mental health courts, drug courts, veterans courts, and extreme risk protection order programs.

The current awards will provide funding and support personnel for critical training initiatives for law enforcement throughout the Commonwealth.

DCJS submitted three (3) applications for FY25, totaling \$2,617,045. The first grant, the JAG DCJS Active Attack Program and Training Grant, for \$1,303,260., would support personnel and provide specific law enforcement training to law enforcement agencies and civilians. The second grant, the JAG DCJS Law Enforcement and Public Safety Training Grant, for \$588,785., would support personnel and provide specific contracted training services to law enforcement and other criminal justice professionals throughout Virginia. The third grant, the JAG DCJS Office of First Responder Wellness Program Grant, for \$725,000., would support personnel and resources dedicated to first responder wellness training and programming.

The grant period for these awards would be from July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025.

No applications were denied.

In summary, DCJS staff request **approval to fund 3 awards**, **totaling \$2,617,045.00 through the FY 2025 Byrne Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) for DCJS to provide law enforcement training throughout the Commonwealth**.
