Instructions for classroom instructors and other school staff members:

This survey is being given to three groups of education professions working in Virginia's public schools:

- 1. Classroom instructors (teachers and teacher's aides and assistants) whose primary job responsibility is interacting with students in classroom settings;
- 2. School staff members whose primary job responsibility is interacting with students external to the classroom settings and who hold a state professional license, such as a Collegiate Professional License, a Postgraduate Professional License, or a Pupil Personnel Services License; and,
- 3. At a school's discretion, school staff members who do not hold a state professional license whose primary job responsibility is not interacting with students in classroom settings.

All classroom instructors and school staff members are asked to complete the survey regardless of the grade level of the students with whom they teach or interact. The purpose of the survey is to help schools create and maintain safe and supportive working environments for education professionals in Virginia's public schools.

Your individual answers to the survey are anonymous, which means that no one will know how you answered. It is important that you submit **only one completed survey** for each school at which you work.

Some of the questions differ for classroom instructors and school staff members. The survey should take you 20-25 minutes to complete.

In order to access the online survey, you must enter the unique Access Code for the adult survey which was assigned to your school. Your principal, or your principal's designee, will have this Access Code for you. All classroom instructors and school staff members at the same school will have the same Access Code, so you will not be identified by this Access Code. It is important that you submit **only one completed survey** for each school at which you work. The administrators of this survey are obligated to protect your identity.
