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Welcome to your school's Item-Level Report for the *2023 Virginia School Survey of Climate and Working Conditions*. This report summarizes how your instructors responded to the survey in aggregate.

We received 49,350 classroom instructor (teacher and teacher's assistant) responses to this survey which equates to a response rate of 65.6%.

As you read through the results, each question (or block of questions) will report the percentages of how the questions were answered (Percentage), and the subtotal (Count) for each response type. For example:
