Select Virginia Legislation with Safety Mandates for Institutions of Higher Education

A vital role of the Virginia Department of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) Division of Public Safety Training and the Virginia Center for School and Campus Safety (PST-VCSCS) is to stay abreast of past, current, and potential future legislation impacting school safety in the Commonwealth. Campus Security Officers – Minimum Standards and Training	
Virginia Code Section	Description
<u>§ 9.1-102.46.</u>	<p>The Department of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) (and thereby the Virginia Center for School and Campus Safety) is required to establish minimum standards for (i) employment, (ii) job-entry and in-service training curricula, and (iii) certification requirements for campus security officers. Such training standards shall include the role and responsibility of campus security officers, relevant state and federal laws, school and personal liability issues, security awareness in the campus environment, and disaster and emergency response.</p> <p>DCJS further provides technical support and assistance to campus police departments and campus security departments on the establishment and implementation of policies and procedures, including but not limited to: the management of such departments, investigatory procedures, judicial referrals, the establishment and management of databases for campus safety and security information sharing, and development of uniform record keeping for disciplinary records and statistics, such as campus crime logs, judicial referrals and Clery Act statistics.</p>

Threat Assessment	
Virginia Code Section	Description
§ 23.1-805	Violence prevention committee; threat assessment team. Each threat assessment team member shall complete a minimum of eight hours of initial training within 12 months of appointment to the threat assessment team and shall complete a minimum of two hours of threat assessment training each academic year thereafter. <i>Training shall be conducted by the Department of Criminal Justice Services or an independent entity approved by the Department.</i>

§ 23.1-806	Reporting of acts of sexual violence
§ 23.1-807	Sexual assault; memoranda of understanding; policies
§ 23.1-807.1	Baccalaureate public institutions of higher education; provision of physical evidence recovery kits

<u>§ 23.1-808</u>	Sexual violence; policy review; disciplinary immunity for certain individuals who make reports

Virginia Code Section	Description
<u>§ 23.1-820</u>	<u>Hazing</u> prevention training; current members, new members, potential new members, and advisors
<u>§ 23.1-821</u>	Hazing; certain individuals who make reports; disciplinary immunity; investigation; information about on-campus mental and behavioral health support
<u>§ 23.1-822</u>	Institutional reports of Hazing Violations

<u>§ 23.1-407</u>	Reporting of enrollment information to Sex Offender and Crimes Against Minors Registry

<u>§ 23.1-802.2</u>	Resident assistant opioid antagonist administration training required
<u>§ 23.1-808.1</u>	Human trafficking awareness and prevention training; first-year orientation
