licensed staff serving Pre-K through 8th grades and all 6th-8th grade students will be offered the survey this year. Our 2022 Virginia School Survey of Climate and Working Conditions Report is live. Over 99.5% of eligible schools participated with response rates above 62%. Can we beat those percentages this year?

# **School Safety Spotlight**



Have you heard of Handle With Care Virginia yet?

We want to thank the <u>Richmond Times-Dispatch</u> and the <u>National Center for School</u> <u>Safety</u> who both shared articles about the program last quarter.

Handle With Care (HWC) connects first responders with children's schools to alert the school of a potential exposure to trauma. Any time law enforcement, fire, or EMS responds to an incident and there is a child on the scene, the school receives a notification of just the child's name and to "Handle With Care." This allows school officials to monitor for any behavior changes and provide trauma sensitive supports if needed.

The ultimate HWC goal is to help students succeed in school.
