Subject: New Legislative Training Requirements for K-12 Public School Threat Assessment Team Members

To provide ongoing support and resources to school threat assessment teams, the Virginia Department of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) is pleased to provide the following information regarding legislative updates to threat assessment teams effective July 1, 2023, and the provision of free training by the Virginia Center for School and Campus Safety (VCSCS):

1. Behavioral Threat Assessment Teams, Required Training

Effective July 1, 2023, new legislative requirements will be added in the *Code of Virginia*, section C of § 22.1-79.4. The updates will require each new threat assessment team member at each public elementary and secondary school to complete an initial threat assessment training, and that all threat assessment team members complete refresher training every three years.

2. Access to free K-12 Behavioral Threat Assessment and Management (BTAM) training and Model Policies, Procedures, and Guidelines

Beginning August 1, 2023, the full-day Basic K-12 BTAM training is being condensed to a 4-hour training. Additionally, a 4-hour refresher training will also be offered by the VCSCS. In-person trainings for both courses will be available upon request to school divisions. Virtual trainings will also be offered on multiple dates and open to all threat assessment team members through a general registration process and announced through DCJS training announcements.

The <u>"Threat Assessment and Management in Virginia Public Schools: Model Policies, Procedures, and</u> <u>Guidelines</u>" will be updated to reflect the new legislatively required training and made available by July 1, 2023. The fifth edition will be available both electronically and in print at that time.
