Virginia Sexual and Domestic Violence Program Professional Standards Committee

Code of Virginia: 9.1-116.3

The Virginia Sexual and Domestic Violence Program Professional Standards Committee (the Committee):

- Shall establish voluntary accreditation standards and procedures by which local sexual and domestic violence programs can be systematically measured and evaluated with a peer-reviewed process.
- May **adopt bylaws** for its operation, membership terms, fees, and other items as necessary.
- *Fees for accreditation* shall be used to support any administrative costs of the Department.
- Upon request of the Committee, the Department and the Virginia sexual and domestic violence coalition may provide **accreditation assistance and training and resource material** that will assist the local programs in obtaining or retaining accreditation.

Vision/Purpose/Value Statement

<u>Vision</u>

Throughout Virginia, all those impacted by Sexual and Domestic Violence have accessible, communitydriven quality services and resources.

<u>Purpose</u>

To create standards that:

- 1. Credential Sexual and Domestic Violence agencies.
- 2. Ensure research-based best practices and inspire Sexual and Domestic Violence organizations to learn and evolve in order to best meet the needs of all those impacted by Sexual and Domestic Violence.
- 3. Ensure an informed core level of services is available to all those impacted by Sexual and Domestic Violence throughout Virginia.
