



Barrier Crimes to Achieving SCOP Appointment:

Misdemeanors Involving:

(a) moral turpitude

(b) assault and battery

(c) damage to real or personal property

(d) controlled substances or imitation controlled substances as defined in Article 1 (§ 18.2-247 et seq.) of Chapter 7 of Title 18.2

(e) prohibited sexual behavior as described in Article 7 (§ 18.2-61 et seq.) of Chapter 4 of Title 18.2

(f) firearms

(g) any felony

§19.2–13 (B) Code of Virginia







Recommendations for Improvement

- VSP notifies the issuing Circuit Court and DCJS when an SCOP has been arrested, is the subject of a protective order, has been ordered into treatment, have been involuntarily committed or agreed to voluntary admittance subsequent to a temporary detention order.
- Circuit Court should be required to notify VSP and DCJS when the court revokes an SCOP order.
