## What Legal Process Do I Need?

## Remember:

In almost every case, a *Search Warrant* can obtain the information you are seeking.

(This chart presumes you cannot get the information you are seeking through consent.)

In order of least powerful to most powerful, the forms of legal process are:

Administrative Subpoenas: The Commonwealth's Attorney can issue an Admin Subpoena.

**Grand Jury Subpoena**: A Special or Multi-jurisdictional Grand Jury can issue a subpoena.

**Court Orders:** Only a Circuit Court Judge can issue a Court Order

**Search Warrants:** A Magistrate, General District Court Judge, or Circuit Court Judge can issue a Search Warrant.

<u>Title III Wiretap</u>: The Virginia Attorney General must participate to obtain this type of Circuit Court order
