Youth Adapting



- When the youth gangs realized that by being identified as a gang member would give them an enhanced criminal charge, they started dropping their identifiers.
- Except in large urban areas that have established national and trans-national gang communities, many have changed their identities to the area where they come from.

Youth Gang Changes



- They still commit gang-like crimes, but don't identify the groups they commit the crimes for.
- They are leaving national models and are becoming more independent and community-based
 - Gangs with members who have spent time in DOC may retain national affiliation(s).
- They may continue to use national colors, models, and rules.

Youth Gang Identity



- · Juvenile gang members are seeking their own identities.
- Because of this, when they do identify as a gang, they may use gang identifiers that come from different gangs...
 - Even those that have historically been rivals!

Fast Forward to Now



- The previous <u>5 slides are two years old</u>, and some of it is outdated or has changed!
 - Much of it still applies, but in some communities, youth are shunning attachment to a gang name, and acting as nameless
- About 5-6 years ago, juvenile gangs changed how they present and identify themselves.
 - This is not seen in all communities, but is trending upward.


Why the changes?




- Many have learned what the law is that defines what a Criminal Street Gang is (§18.2-46.1) and don't use an identifier.
- They still commit gang-like crimes, but minimize wearing any identifiable color or symbol.
- Because of the COVID 19 quarantine, many have relied on social media for interaction with their peers and/or rivals.
 - They are also being influenced more by social media sites promoting violence.












































Any person who actively participates in or is a member of a criminal street gang

and who knowingly and willfully participates in any predicate criminal act


committed for the benefit of, at the direction of, or in association with any criminal street gang shall be guilty of a Class 5 felony.

If such participant in or member of a criminal street gang is age eighteen years or older and knows or has reason to know that such criminal street gang also includes a juvenile member or participant; he/she shall be guilty of a class 4 felony.

























